ALL SAINTS

First Reading: Revelations 7:2-4, 9-14

John recounts for us the details of his vision. An angel bearing the seal of the living God demands that the land and sea not be destroyed; huge crowds stand before the throne of the Lamb crying out that salvation comes from God; angels gathered round and praised God; an elder questions John and explains that those dressed in white are the ones who have survived the great period of trial.

Second Reading: 1 John 3:1-3

Once again John speaks to us of love. He points out to us the great love that the Father has for us by allowing us to be called children of God. John explains that the world doesn't recognize us because it never recognized Jesus. Our future will be revealed to us and in that light we shall see him as he is.

Gospel: Matthew 5:1-12a

When Jesus saw the crowds of people he went up to the mountainside gathered his disciples around him and began to teach them. This lesson in love has come to be known to us as the great "Sermon on the Mount" or "The Beatitudes."

DÍA DE TODOS LOS SANTOS

Primera Lectura: Apocalipsis 7:2-4, 9-14

San Juan describe los detalles de su visión. Un ángel, portando el sello del Dios viviente demanda que ni la tierra ni el mar sean destruídos; grandes multitudes se encuentran frente al trono del Cordero gritando que la salvación viene de Dios; ángeles se reúnen y alaban a Dios; un anciano pregunta a Juan y luego explica que aquellos vestidos de blanco son los sobrevivientes de un período de gran tribulación.

Segunda Lectura: 1 San Juan 3:1-3

De nuevo San Juan nos habla del amor. Nos señala el gran amor que el Padre nos tiene al permitirnos ser llamados hijos de Dios. San Juan explica que el mundo no nos reconoce porque nunca reconoció a Jesús. Nuestro futuro será revelado a nosotros y que en esa luz lo veremos como lo que El es.

Evangelio: San Mateo 5:1-12a
